Shepherd's Crossing: The Hidden Gem of Catholic Care Center

If you've ever taken the time to drive around the Catholic Care Center campus, you've probably noticed the patio home community, Shepherd's Crossing. What you may not have realized is that this is the independent living residence of Catholic Care Center.

Shepherd's Crossing opened on the campus in 2006 and was one of Wichita's first patio home establishments. The community was designed to allow seniors the opportunity to age in a place with easily accessible homes while having the peace of mind that comes with being on the Catholic Care Center campus with priority access to additional services if their future needs change.

Each spacious home offers two bedrooms, two baths, a two-car garage, a full kitchen, a living room, and a sunroom or patio. In 2016, the Shepherd's Crossing Community Center opened as a gathering place for residents and as a meeting space for ministry and community events.

The Center features a fitness area, The Landing restaurant, an activity room, and several social spaces that lend themselves to various events including musical performances, speakers, and resident dinners. Today, Shepherd's Crossing offers 92 patio homes to over 130 residents.

Since its establishment 18 years ago, the community has seen many changes and faced some challenges, including a hail storm that required the roof of every home to be replaced and the pandemic, which led to some very creative ways of staying connected with friends and neighbors.

One thing that hasn't changed is the cohesive and welcoming group of residents who make their home at Shepherd's Crossing. They are truly the lifeblood of the community and help make it a great place to live!

Pumpkin Gingerbread with Chef Shawn

This fun holiday treat combines two classics into one delicious bread. It makes a great gift, or you can treat yourself to a slice with your morning coffee!

Ingredients:

1 cup sugar
2 cups brown sugar
1 cup vegetable oil
4 eggs
2/3 cup water
1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree
2 teaspoons ground ginger
1 teaspoon ground allspice
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground cloves
3 ½ cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking soda
1 ½ teaspoons salt
½ teaspoon baking powder

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease two 9x5 inch loaf pans.

In a large mixing bowl, combine sugar, oil, and egg. Beat until smooth. Add water and beat until well blended. Stir in pumpkin puree, ginger, allspice, cinnamon, and cloves.

In a medium bowl, combine flour, soda, salt, and baking powder. Add dry ingredients to pumpkin mixture and blend just until all ingredients are mixed. Divide batter between prepared pans.

Bake in preheated oven until toothpick comes out clean, about 1 hour. Let cool and enjoy!

Volunteer Spotlight Artist, Annie Cummings

Annie Cummings is a familiar face at Catholic Care Center's Assisted Living area, where she frequently visits her mother, long-time resident Laura Cummings. Annie is well known to the other Assisted Living residents as the leader of a monthly painting class, where attendees tackle a new specific painting project.

During the 3 years the class has been in session, residents have expressed their creativity using many different mediums and styles of painting. Annie's creative talents are also on display as she updates the Assisted Living chalkboard monthly with creative seasonal designs.

Annie's talents didn't develop overnight. As a child, she loved to paint and draw. When Annie was in her early 20s living in Steamboat Springs, CO, she had the opportunity to work with an experienced artist who shared her knowledge of oil painting with Annie.

Her painting moved to the back burner after Annie received her degree in Natural Resource Management and entered the workforce. Some of her employment history included working for the Forest Service and at Pike's Peak Community College, where she was instrumental in developing the Natural Resource Technical Degree Program. This program is still going strong today!

Let's fast-forward to retirement, when Annie dusted off her paintbrushes and discovered "en plein air painting," which is the act of painting outdoors. This method of painting has allowed Annie to combine her love of painting with her love of nature, all while sharing these interests with others.

Recently, Annie attended a plein air painting show in Steamboat Springs, CO, where she exhibited five paintings, one of which won the Steamboat Springs Corporate Award! The show's judges commented that they chose Annie's painting because they felt it embodied both the feel of "new" and "old" Steamboat Springs.

This feedback was especially meaningful to Annie because it confirmed that her painting successfully conveyed both Annie's memories of Steamboat Springs as a young person and her current observations of the city in a way that was recognizable to others.

Annie has also previously exhibited at the Wichita River Fest Art Show, where she had two second-place finishes. She sold some of her paintings at this event, one of which was a view of Downtown Wichita.

If you'd like to see her work in person, Annie has two upcoming shows, one at the Carriage Factory in Newton and one at the Andover Library!

Annie considers herself an emerging artist. To her, the biggest compliment an artist can receive is when someone purchases a painting. The sale of a painting confirms that the recipient understands an artist's communication, appreciates it, and wants to bring it home

to continue enjoying. The ability to share her joy with others continues to motivate Annie.

As a busy artist and dedicated daughter, we appreciate that Annie is willing to donate her time to our community and look forward to the new chalkboard mural each month. 
